

For some, those wounds are still raw and the thirst for vengeance unquenched. Half a world away, a seemingly innocent woman is brutally murdered and her infant grandchild abducted – all in the name of justice. In Antoinette van Heugten's THE TULIP EATERS (Harlequin/MIRA, November 2013, \$15.95), the bestselling author of *Saving Max* transports readers back to the darkest days of World War II and explores the power the past wields over the present.

Nora de Jong returns home from a grueling day at work and walks right into a nightmare – her Dutch mother has been murdered and her infant daughter, Rose, is missing. As she tries to make sense of the horrific tableau in her living room, she comes across the strangest piece of the puzzle: a dead stranger sprawled on the floor, clutching a World War II-era Luger in his hand.

Knowing that each passing day diminishes any chance of recovering her baby, Nora must put aside her grief to search for Rose. Frustrated with a stalled police effort, she follows a lead to Amsterdam to research her mother's past. Digging deep into her family's history – too deep for some – Nora uncovers a side of her parents she never knew about and begins to see how the actions of a past generation could spell doom for a future one.

As in the critically acclaimed *Saving Max*, van Heugten thrills readers by showing a frantic mother, terrified but determined to save her child – no matter how crazy the police think she is or what horrifying family truths she must uncover. Knowing she can't rest until her baby is safe is an uncontrollable obsession to which every parent can relate. In THE TULIP EATERS, van Heugten paints this picture like no other author today.
